May 7

CONTEMPORARY DANCE

Spacetime is a contemporary dance piece choreographed by Guðmundur Helgason for a workshop founded by the Iceland Dance Company. In this abstract piece the choreographer deals with the concepts of time and space and how they intertwine into a scenario.

Three dancers born in different decades and different places unite in movement until they find their own way. The interaction between dancers, time, space and nature is the main theme for this piece.

KLASSART BLUES BAND

Klassart first made an impression on the Icelandic music scene when they won the 2006 Blues Song Competition on Icelandic National Radio with the song Bottle of Blues. In the summer of 2007 their debut CD hit the stores and a new album will be released this fall. The band was started by Smári Guðmundsson, older brother of lead singer Friða Dís Guðmundsdóttir. The soothing sound of Klassart perfectly tones with the Blue Lagoon surroundings.

ICELANDIC CHOIR

The Graduale Choir first performed in 1991 and consists of a group of 14-18 year old girls. The selection of programs covers everything from baroque to the most challenging of contemporary compositions. The choir has received significant attention for the ease and joy they bring to performing these demanding compositions. They will be singing some of Iceland's most beloved songs.

RUBBISH POETRY

An Icelandic actor, Bergur Ingólfsson, from the City Theater in Reykjavík, will be performing a session of "rubbish-poetry". Although not yet widely known, this art form is related to rap and hip-hop but without the music. This is simply poetry without a poem. It is storytelling without a story. It's "rubbish-poetry" and will be presented in English and Icelandic.

Sunday May 18 at 9pm

The Icelandic Pocket Company is a group of well known musicians. They will have an unusual music performance at the Blue Lagoon, both funny and educational, going around the world in 18 minutes. It is based on an Icelandic folk song. The event marks the end of the Opening Weekend of the Reykjavik Arts Festival. The Blue Lagoon will extend the opening hours for this event.
